Month 1 (Rosh Chodesh)	April 2 sunset to April 3 sunset
Passover (Pesach)	April 15 sunset the Pesach seder begins (complete before sunrise April 16)
Hag HaMatzah Day 1	April 16 sunset to April 17 sunset (High Sabbath)
Omer Day 1	April 17 sunset to April 18 sunset (begin 50 day count)
Hag HaMatzah Day 7	April 22 sunset to April 23 sunset (High Sabbath)
Month 2 (Rosh Chodesh)	May 2 sunset to May 3 sunset
Month 3 (Rosh Chodesh)	May 31 sunset to June 1 sunset
Shavuot/Omer Day 50	June 5 sunset to June 6 sunset (High Sabbath)
Month 4 (Rosh Chodesh)	June 30 sunset to July 1 sunset
Fast of the Fourth Month	Day 17 of Month 4 (Zechariah 8:19) - July 16 sunset to July 17 sunset
Month 5 (Rosh Chodesh)	July 29 sunset to July 30 sunset
Fast of the Fifth Month	Day 9 of Month 5 (Zechariah 8:19) – August 6 sunset to August 7 sunset
Month 6 (Rosh Chodesh)	August 28 sunset to August 29 sunset
Month 7 (Yom Teruah)	September 27 sunset to September 28 sunset (High Sabbath)
Fast of the Seventh Month	Day 3 of Month 7 (Zechariah 8:19) – Sept. 29 sunset to Sept. 30 sunset
Yom Kippur	October 6 sunset to October 7 sunset (High Sabbath)
Succot Day 1	October 11 sunset to October 12 sunset (High Sabbath)
Succot Day 7	October 17 sunset to October 18 sunset (Hoshana Rabbah)
Shemini Atzeret (8 <sup>th</sup> Day)	October 18 sundown to October 19 sundown (High Sabbath)
Month 8 (Rosh Chodesh)	October 27 sunset to October 28 sunset
Month 9 (Rosh Chodesh)	November 25 sunset to November 26 sunset
Month 10 (Rosh Chodesh)	December 24 sunset to December 25 sunset
Fast of the Tenth Month	Day 10 of Month 10 (Zechariah 8:19) – sunset Jan. 2 to sunset Jan. 3, 2023
Month 11 (Rosh Chodesh)	January 23, 2023 sunset to January 4, 2023 sunset
Month 12 (Rosh Chodesh)	February 21, 2023 sunset to February 22, 2023 sunset
